# **SANCTIFICATION (PART 2)**

## THE PRIORITY OF HOLINESS

Two passages demonstrating that holiness is the priority of the Christian life:

## **ECCLESIASTES 12:13-14**

Man's one duty in this life is God-fearing obedience! Seven characteristics of Ecclesiastes 12:13–14 demonstrate the truth of this claim.

- I. Location
  - A. Included after so many words
  - B. Included as the last word
- II. Finality
  - A. We've arrived at our destination
  - B. We've finished hearing instruction
- III. Order
  - A. Direct objects
    - 1. God
    - 2. Commandments
  - B. Imperatives
    - 1. Fear!
    - 2. Keep!
- IV. Simplicity
  - A. The straightforwardness of the passage is illustrative
  - B. The brevity of the passage is illustrative
- V. Singularity
  - A. Two commands
    - 1. Fear God!
    - 2. Keep his commandments!
  - B. Singular elements
    - 3. A singular pronoun
    - 4. An implied singular verb
- VI. Impartiality
  - A. Toward people
  - B. Toward deeds
  - C. Toward secrets

## VII. Logic

- A. God-fearing obedience is to be prioritized because man is duty-bound
- B. God-fearing obedience is to be prioritized because God is Judge

# **COLOSSIANS 1:28-29**

A formula for properly proclaiming Christ includes three elements:

- I. The right methods
  - A. Warning with all wisdom
  - B. Teaching with all wisdom
- II. The right motivation
  - A. The minister's accountability is in view (we...present)
  - B. The possibility of loss is in view (subjunctive mood, "might")
  - C. The goal of maturity is in view
  - D. The realm of sanctification is in view (Christ himself)
- III. The right means
  - A. Relentless labor
  - B. Submissive labor
    - 1. Christ is working
    - 2. Our work must be in keeping with Christ's work
  - C. Dependent labor
    - 1. Christ is working in me
    - 2. Christ is working in power
